

SPOTLIGHT ON EDUCATION

LAUNCHing The INTERNATIONAL STEM CELL and Gene Therapy for neurodevelopmental disorders CONFERENCE AT UC Davis MIND Institute

In January 2019, SENSES CULTURAL held a preliminary planning meeting with health leaders at the UC Davis MIND Institute to discuss collaborative measures to hold an international stem cell research conference. The conference will advance stem cell research in the fields of autism and neurodevelopmental disorders. Due to the pandemic, the conference which was

scheduled to take place in September 2020 was postponed to 2021. But Senses Cultural has secured funding to sponsor the participation of a top specialist in mitochondria and cell fate reprogramming at the Max Delbruck Center for Molecular Medicine (MDC) in Berlin, Germany. and the differences between collectivist (Middle Eastern) and individualistic (American) cultural approaches to treating trauma in autistic communities.





SPOTLIGHT ON AUTISM BEYOND BORDERS

SENSES CULTURAL HOLDS WORKSHOP ON AUTISM WITH A MIDDLE EASTERN FOCUS

Advocacy Advisor Robert Miller moderated a workshop on Autism with a Middle Eastern Focus this year. Mr. Miller tied his experience with the organization to his travels to the Middle East on behalf of SENSES CULTURAL, to discuss our work filling an important gap to make sure that families from a Middle Eastern background, whether they live in the region or in the US, have access to all the knowledge and services available to serve children with special needs including autism and other neurodevelopmental disorders. The workshop brought

together four prominent speakers from UC Davis and The Mind Institute, and the Sacramento health community, to offer evidence-based practice and research in the area. Themes covered in the workshop included migration-related trauma for autistic children, disability rights advocacy in California for migrant communities, Middle Eastern cultural barriers to treating autism, and the causes of autism.

SPONSORING RESEARCH TO ADVANCE THE SCIENCE OF AUTISM AND NEURODEVELOPMENTAL DISORDERS

SENSES CULTURAL and the UC Davis Mind Institute are exploring a research partnership with the Max Delbruck Center for Molecular Medicine (MDC) in Berlin, Germany, to advance the science of autism and neurodevelopmental disorders. In 2019, SENSES CULTURAL launched a fundraising campaign for this research project, including at Google, which matches funds given in memory of SENSES CULTURAL Advisory Board Member Dr. Marzieh Forghani who sadly passed away this year, after devoting her life to helping children and migrant communities dealing with autism in California.


