We ended the year feeling proud of our achievements to reach a global audience. Our efforts to promote autism awareness took us to the Middle East and across Iran. With support from local professional groups and communities, SENSES **CULTURAL** held international conferences and workshops on autism, an Art for Autism exhibition. We also organized horseback riding sessions for children with autism, and visited early intervention schools. Above all, we were lucky to be able to deliver autism services in Iran through a U.S. Treasury Department OFAC License to work in the country.

Back in the United States, SENSES CULTURAL launched a scholarship fund to provide partial research support for two highly qualified professionals to work on advancing the research on autism at the UC Davis MIND Institute. The university supported our initiative to hold autism awareness workshops on campus for Middle Eastern families and communities.



This is just the beginning for us, and we are thankful for your support to help us launch incredible programs. SENSES CULTURAL and its cross-disciplinary team is an organization with a track record of good will to promote the education on autism, and to support academic institutions that work in the field.




















ORGANIZED A DAY OF HORSEBACK RIDING FOR CHILDREN WITH AUTISM IN IRAN
